# From the Pastor's Desk

These days, I have been spending some time thinking about membership vows. If you are a member of First United Methodist Church (or joined one of its predecessor denominations), you took membership vows. You said that you would support this congregation by your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service, and your witness. If I were to ask you how you're doing on fulfilling your membership vows, how would you rank yourself? As we're continuing to emerge from the pandemic, I think most of us might say we've been a little negligent at fulfilling our membership vows. I know that there are some of these areas where I can improve.

You may not realize this, but your fulfillment of your membership vows doesn't just affect you - it affects our entire congregation. When you're not present (in-person or online) in worship, in Bible study, in Sunday School, in Kids' Club, in Refresh, or other ministries, it affects the whole ministry. When you offer your gifts (financially, by serving, or otherwise), you make an impact far beyond yourself. When you say yes to serve on a committee, or to teach a class, your service (or lack thereof) and improve or impede the church's witness to the world. How you speak and interact with other people (both inside and outside of the church) matters with how people encounter your faith, and how you show them Christ.

This month, we're thinking about the ways that we care for one another. I hope that, as we approach World Communion Sunday, our 175th anniversary celebration, and All Saints' Day, you will take some time to think about how this congregation has tried to care for you - for your spiritual life, your emotional health, and even your physical body - over the time that you've been a part of this congregation. St. Paul makes it clear in his letters to churches that congregations function best when each part of the body of Christ works together to build one another up in love.

I don't know about you, but I feel like our congregation tries to do that for each person. We offer lots of Bible studies and small groups that meet at different times and in different formats (in-person and online) to meet people where they are in 2021. Our Stephen Ministry walks with people in difficult times of their lives. Seldom does a birthday or anniversary go by without an acknowledgement from our card ministry (thanks, Kay Albin!). We've been calling and checking on each other. These recent months have seen deaths in our congregation, and we've been feeding families. We're here for you, but we also need you - your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service, and your witness to make the greatest impact on each other and our community. Won't you covenant with me to live out those membership vows together?
